Communion Reflection... "I'll be so happy when I have this." "All I need is that to be happy!" How we fill in the blank for this or that is different for each person. What gives us a sense of happiness? Being able to have some alone time? Our favourite kind of pizza or ice cream? A nice cold drink? The end of the work day? That all makes sense, and it's good! We live in a beautiful world that God created and gave us. But to be happy? Should something so deep really depend on what we're eating or drinking? Jesus tells us over and over again that our real, true, lasting happiness is in God. No matter what else happens to us, we're invited to be at peace, resting in the sure knowledge that God loves us. We find out that although certain things may give us happy feelings, they're actually all made of sand, and we can, indeed, find deep, true happiness without them.



Sometimes the suffering that comes into our lives is expected, and we can prepare for it. But other times, it's a shock and a surprise, and life seems turned upside down. When we are in that place of

confusion and shock, we must try to remember that we are not alone. Jesus has been in that place, and Jesus is with us in that moment. We may want to ask, "Why?" and "What next?" –and we should. But if we have the habit of saying his name, remembering how he suffered too, we won't feel so helpless or alone. We come to Jesus with our whole hearts. That means we bring him our happy times and good feelings-and our sadness. We bring him our shame, our mistakes and our sins. We do this with trust because we see him suffering on the cross, and we know he is there because he loves us. In that place of suffering, he brings us to the Father, into his heart of forgiveness and mercy.


