



Communion Reflection... Abraham and son Isaac carried wood, a knife and fire toward the place where they would make a sacrifice. They carried no animal, but the Lord provided the lamb. Throughout the Old Testament, God required his people to make many sacrifices of a lamb without blemish. Numbers 28 specifies daily, weekly and monthly sacrifices, plus other feasts. What was the purpose of so many burnt offerings? Hebrews 10:3-4 explains that the sacrifices were a constant reminder of sins but could not take them away. Only the sacrifice of Jesus, the Lamb without blemish, could take away sins. On the cross, "this he did once for all when he offered himself." During Lent and the Easter season, we humbly recall this outpouring of love. Through faith, we receive God's salvation bought, "with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without ...blemish."



Many Christian's feel there is little that they are qualified to do for Christ's Easter Message mission. "When the gifts were passed out, I was passed by." However, all of

us have been given a unique variety of gifts and abilities by our Creator. Some of them may seem more valuable or attract more attention. But no gift that God gives is useless. And no human being that God creates is worthless. In fact, each of us is worth so much to God that he was willing to do whatever it takes to bring us back into his family and kingdom. It meant that he himself, in the person of his Son, became the sacrificial lamb. God's plan for all of us is to combine our spiritual gifts and skills to form a magnificent mosaic, filled with the beauty of Christ's kindness, compassion and forgiveness.




The testing of our faith in Jesus comes in all shaped and sizes. That testing isn't arbitrary. God's not picking on
