Communion Reflection... How many times have we asked God to save us from pain, fear or challenging circumstances? Often, God does spare us, and our worries were without reason. Other times, we have to bear with things and find the courage to face difficulties. If we cooperate with God in these seasons of trial, he uses the challenges to refine and strengthen us. It is precisely there, in our times of perceived weakness or brokenness, that he shows his power and presence in our lives. Once we know the sufficiency of His grace, we are forever changed. And from this new perspective, He equips us to comfort and encourage others. Our weaknesses become the conduit for His strength.



Be perfect? You've got to be kidding. I don't know anyone who comes even close, although I've known some people who think they have. Jesus' call to a life of complete obedience and holiness drives some seekers to despair. But his initial purpose is to bring us to our knees each

day in humble repentance, confident that God's forgiveness and mercy are new and fresh for us every morning. We will never be perfect on this side of eternity. But God's Spirit moves and motivates us to be compassionate, as our heavenly Father is compassionate. Compassion is more than sympathy. Compassionate disciples walk so closely with other in their pain and struggles that they actually suffer with them, for the sake of our suffering Saviour. Jesus walked the way of sorrows to the cross, where he willingly endured the full wrath of God against sin, so that we might live as his fully forgiven children and serve as his compassionate disciples, through our earthly pilgrimage.

Job: His very name conjures up images of PASTOR suffering. Job was blameless, upright, generous, all of that-but not sinless. We

know because later he yearns to see his Redeemers. Job had a mature, focused faith in God. You know someone like him. Life is lived in the tension between chaos and overcontrol. Suffering pushed us into chaos, death being the ultimate disorder-er. We see this in the book of Job: order, then disorder, finally the Lord speaks, and order is restored. What we seek when we're suffering is the restoration of some sort of normalcy. Suffering has one benefit: it forces us to examine what we believe about God. Do I trust him even though my condition isn't good now? Why has he chosen this kind of suffering for me? Every time Jesus healed or raised, it was God bringing order out of disorder. It is God's mercy applied by Jesus that restores order to shattered lives-even our own.

Baptism Preparation... The Baptism of your child is an important event in the life of St. John's and St. Cornelius Parish. It is the beginning of a life-long relationship with Christ and with His Church. If you are new to the parish or have perhaps not registered yet please do so by using parish envelopes.
