

Communion Reflection... It's not easy to

The result is that they end up with a withered heart. And it's impossible to breathe life into a withered heart. To close one's heart is to begin to die. To open one's heart is to begin to live. At the end of the day it's not what we carry in our purses or bank accounts that matters. It's what we carry in our hearts. That is where the rich are found wanting. Poverty of heart is the worst form of poverty.


