



Communion Reflection... "I want to be free to do what I want to do!" Like a cut flower, this idea of freedom looks good, but it has no roots and no real life. Jesus offers us true freedom, rooted in the teachings of his cross. The cross reveals the truth of God's saving grace and love. It frees us from bondage to sin, gives us roots of true freedom, frees us to live in the will of God. Faith in Christ gives us a new heart, rooted in grace, wanting the Father's will instead of our own. Our lifelong challenge is to deny the urge to practice "root-less" freedom and to live in the true freedom rooted in our Saviour. The cross frees us from bondage to sin and self, frees us to live in the privilege of life as our Creator intended for his children.



What an awesome present Jesus gives us From the each time we gather for his sacred meal, Partor where we receive his very presence, in and with the bread and wine. What magnificent

gifts he shares with us anew each time-his cleansing forgiveness and strength for our journey of faith. We may have taken for granted that the Lord's Supper would always be there for us-until the pandemic upended our worship life. Many of us went months without receiving Holy Communion. We know Jesus is with us always. But he is present in the Eucharist in a very personal way. What a joy it was when we could return to the Lord's house to receive our Lord's forgiving love and renewing power in this Sacrament. May we never take our church community's in-person worship for granted again. And may the receiving of the Lord's Supper never become merely a routine for us.

Remembrance Day

Remembrance Day was first observed in 1919 throughout the British Commonwealth. It was



originally called "Armistice Day" to commemorate the armistice agreement that ended the First World War on Monday, November 11, 1918, at 11 am—on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. Every year on November 11, Canadians pause in a moment of silence to honour and remember the men and women who have served, and continue to serve Canada during times of war, conflict and peace. We remember the more than 2,300,000 Canadians who have served throughout our nation's history and the more than 118,000 who made the ultimate sacrifice. This year, though we may not be able to gather at the cenotaph, we can still honour the brave men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice for their country.

Will we continue to remember our war heroes? I hope so. Some say "let the dead bury their dead," however, and with many veterans passing on, the future of Remembrance Day can seem as bleak as the November sky. The lapel pins we wear on Remembrance Day actually started as a fund-raiser for Belgian children orphaned by the Great War. Will our own children care in the future? They should. It is important to use this day as an opportunity to encourage people to think about where we've gotten using war as a solution to our problems, to think about the lives lost and to think about new ways we can make the world a better place. There are so few people left alive who know what a global war is like. Soon, there won't be any. We wear the poppy in remembrance. If the poppy, a symbol of death and loss, doesn't also serve as a potent symbol of the need for peace, what could? You can tell people what happened long ago, and that's history – nothing can change it, but it is not something that should be forgotten, nor should the men and women who gave so much for the freedom we now enjoy. On November 11 we remember those who gave their life for others, our war heroes and our first responders.

Today's Quote: They shall not grow old, as we that are left grow old. Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning we will remember them.

From the Maine, circa 1890, a father teachers his daughter a lesson about God: "No need prayin, to God 150 prayin' to God. If you're deservin', no need askin'. If you're not deservin', no

use askin'." Some seminary students like to tell their professors what they know. One professor after listening to one such student, nodded, "Hmmm, sure-but where'd you get that idea?" Similarily, we want to ask the father quoted here, "Hmmm, where'd you get that idea about God? Because you sure didn't get it from the Bible." If God answered prayers based on merit, no prayer would be answered. If God's patience was based on merit, we'd feel his wrath every moment. If God saved only the deserving, then we all would be in trouble. Isaiah 41:10 is a simple statement of fact: "No matter what you're going through, how dark or deep the despair, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." In the fullness of time, we'd learn he'd held out his left one too.
