deepest silence, God bursts forth from eternity and into the history of our world. He comes not as a conqueror at the head of a massive host, but rather in the most vulnerable form imaginable: a form that elicits from us an urge to love and protect and nurture. But this is not to say that the infant Christ is not a warrior—it's just his weapons that are different. Christ comes to liberate his people from the slavery of a broken world. The disorder wrought by our fundamental disobedience in the Garden of Eden is reserved in the tiny figure in the manger. His quiet cries in his mother's arms are his battle cry that all has been made new, if we would just love him. Lord Jesus, thank you for the miracle of Christmas. Thank you for the gift of yourself.



It's important that we don't let things end here at the manger. This is not the end of the story, after all. Jesus needs to be rushed to Egypt to keep him from Herod's clutches. Then he needs ristmas to grow up in Nazareth...learn a trade...be part of a family. He needs to gather a group of followers and begin a ministry of healing,

teaching, preaching, and performing wonders that open eyes to the Kingdom of God. And then, of course, he needs to suffer...and to die. And then to rise again, to remind us all that this story doesn't have an ending. It goes on and on, forever and ever for all of us. And that, folks, is a long, long time.


