Communion Reflection... The local evening new may call itself "Eyewitness News," focusing on evewitness accounts at the scene. John was there at the cross as an eyewitness, along with the faithful women. He saw the soldiers pierce Jesus' side and witnessed the flow of blood and water. He also observed Jesus' graveclothes lying there neatly folded, as if Jesus had vanished into thin air. Later, John recorded many of the words of Jesus he had heard, as well as detailed descriptions of events he had witnessed. Near the close of his Gospel, he testified about the central purpose of the Scriptures: "These are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name." Holy Spirit, we thank you for inspiring the biblical writers to record your Word for all time, and for assuring us that "these words are trustworthy and true."



Countless times, we have promised to be faithful to Jesus. But when the pressure was on or temptation came alluring, our faith faltered, and we denied Jesus with out lips or our lives.

We may wonder if Jesus still loves us and if he can forgive our failures to be faithful. Jesus' response leaves no doubt. Surely he will fully forgive us and equip us for faithful and fruitful service in his kingdom. Jesus, we are so grateful that you continue to love us and forgive us, no matter how often we fail you.
