Welcome Back Sunday BBQ



Communion Reflection... Have you ever had someone say, "I know how you feel!" but you think to yourself, "How can you possibly know how I feel? How can you know what I'm going through?" While we may think those thoughts, there's something inside that truly does long for someone to know how we feel. Perhaps if they did, some of the pain could be lifted as we are drawn to that person in compassion and love. The word compassion means "able to feel with, identify with the feelings of others." Matthew says that when Jesus saw the crowds as he made his way to the cross, "he had compassion for them." He didn't pity them, he actually felt their helplessness and pain of life. And do you think Jesus ever stopped feeling and caring for people? People like you and me? I think not.



Not long ago, doctors told my friend they had nothing more they could do for him. They had lost all hope. At his funeral, however, the priest said, "Modern medicine may have reached the end of its power, but God's power was just beginning." St. Paul said: "It is no longer I who

live, but it is Christ who lives in me." Hidden with Christ through faith, we can truly say, "Wherever I go, there goes Jesus." Lord God, heavenly Father, should the day ever come that I hear all hope is gone for me in this life, remind me that Jesus is my hiding place, that he is in me and I am in him. Feast of the Black Madonna



Our Lady of Czestochowa, the "Black Madonna" dates back to the time of the Twelve Apostles, painted by the hand of St. Luke the Evangelist, who used a tabletop from a table built by Jesus during his time as a carpenter. While Luke was painting Mary, she recounted to him the events in the life of Jesus that would eventually be used in his Gospel * 326 AD St. Helen finds the image of

Our Lady and gifts it to her son Constantine, who builds a shrine to venerate it. * The image eventually falls to the care of Charlemagne, who presents it to Prince Leo of Ruthenia (northwest Hungary). * 14th century the image is transferred to Jasna Gora in Poland as an answer to a request made in a dream of Prince Ladislaus of Opola. * 1382 Tartars invaded the Prince's fortress. During the attack an arrow strikes the painting and gets lodged in the neck. The prince flees with the painting during the night stopping in the town of Czestochowa. The painting is placed in a small church, where the prince builds a Pauline monastery and church to ensure its safety. * 1430 Hussites overrun the monastery, attempting to take the image. One of the looters takes the painting, puts it in a wagon and tries to drive away. The horses refuse to move, he strikes the painting twice with his sword, on his third attempt to strike it, he suddenly falls over writhing in pain and dies. * 1655 Poland is almost overrun by King Charles X of Sweden, only the area surrounding the monastery remains unconquered. The monks who live there are somehow able to defend the portrait throughout a 40 day siege. Poland is eventually able to drive out the invaders. King John II Casimir Vasa crowns the image of Our Lady of Czestochowa as Queen of Poland, placing the entire country under her care and protection. * 1920, Russia attempts to invade Poland, with the Russian army gathering on the banks of the Vistula and threatening Warsaw, they see an image of Our Lady in the clouds over the city, and withdraw. * Since the fall of Communism, many people from all over the world flock to Czestochowa on pilgrimages. * July 2016 Pope Francis visits Poland, venerates the image and says Mass. * The nickname "Black Madonna" comes from the soot residue which discolors the painting as a result of centuries of votive lights and candles burned in front of it.
