

### **Communion Reflection...** Admiration ceases

when expectations aren't met. Admiring someone for accomplishments, talents or good moral character is one thing. Trusting someone to bring you peace with God is quite another. During his three year ministry, Jesus attracted many people. But then some of his words seemed impossible to understand: eating flesh, drinking blood for example, people protested. His decisions seemed unwise, dining with sinners. One by one they left him. By the time his work was finished, only one was left standing-rather, hanging: Jesus. Jesus started his Church from scratch, building it with believers, not admirers. The construction began on the third day, went viral at Pentecost and goes on to this very day.



The religious leaders in Jerusalem were amazed and perplexed by the bold witness of Peter and extraordinary things in the name of Jesus. This

has been God's way through the ages. He chose an insignificant people to be "a light to the nations." He chose a humble young woman from an unknown town to be the mother of the Messiah. Jesus selected ordinary people like Andrew and Mary Magdalene to be his faithful witnesses. Jesus continues to choose ordinary people – like you and me - to accomplish extraordinary things for the good and growth of his kingdom. He molds and moves us by his Word and Spirit to be his voice and hands and feet leading others out of the darkness of this world, to live with him in his marvelous and eternal light.

Please pray for peace and especially the people of Ukraine; join us in saying a Hail Mary every day.
