

Communion Reflection... You are created in

God's image who is love, created you in love, for love. Jesus' great command to love one another is about living as you are created to be, to fulfill your mission, the very reason for your existence. As a person who is created in God's image and likeness, you are to reflect and share this image through your actions and interactions, in the ways in which you live your daily life, so that people may know God's love through you. The truth that each person is created in God's image is a reflection of the vast greatness of God. God is not contained in one experience or culture. God is beyond human comprehension. Yet in Jesus Christ, God shows us his desire to be one with us, to be close to us. It is this near, intimate, personal love of God that we are called to share with others. Each of us will do this differently, through the way we spend our time and attention, gifts and blessings, and the talents and skills we have been given.



Grace is a gift. Sometimes we need only reach for it, allowing God to respond. The Gospel account of the woman with the hemorrhage is an example of faith that reaches for God in a

moment of need. Swept forward in a crowd rushing after Jesus to watch him work another miracle, this woman thinks that if only she could touch his cloak, she would be healed. Scripture says Jesus feels his power go out from him. He identifies her and responds to her bold act with gentleness: "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease." Like the suffering woman in this Gospel, often it is simple enough that we reach towards Jesus, asking him for grace, seeking his healing touch. This Lent, think about the times you reached toward the Lord, and he responded.

It is a strange way of thinking, but it does afflict many of us.
