Communion Reflection... Often, when we

speak of gifts, we talk of "time, talent, and treasure." People remark that they understand that time is precious-we do not know when our last day on earth will be, and within each day, each of us only has so many minutes and hours. We understand that charity is important-it is important for us to share our financial and material resources, out of gratitude, for the sake of others. Yet, when we speak of talent, people often do not know what to think. What are talents? How do we know what our talents are? What does it mean to be a good servant of talent? Talents are things we naturally do well, like innately relating to people with ease, organizing information to make it useful, or rallying others to get things done. Taking care of our talents means not only recognizing these natural patterns in our lives, but learning to use them well, and being ready to offer them in our daily interactions at home, work, parish, and world.



What is it that I need to leave behind in order to fully follow Christ? Or is that a calculating question that reveals the half-heartedness of my

commitment to Christ and his mission? Whoever truly dedicated one's life to following Christ and serving him will never count the cost. We might indeed be asked to give up much that is precious to us, and to serve where we would rather not go. Countless Christians through the centuries have given up more than we can calculate for the sake of Christ. Or we may be asked to serve our Lord and our neighbours in need primarily where we live and work and worship. Thankfully, Jesus never calculated the cost of going to the cross in order to set us free from whatever prevents us from fully following him. This much is certain.


