### Communion Reflection... The life of

discipleship is one of ongoing conversion, of becoming more like Christ. It is important to admit there are many times when we are not like Christ! We are tempted by material things, selfish desires, and self-centeredness. To be more like Christ is to turn away from these temptations and to turn toward God and others. Remember the young man who approached Jesus and asked what he should do to attain eternal life? Jesus told him to give away what he had to the poor. We are told the young man went away sad, because he had many things. Things weighed him down. We could say that his possessions possessed him. What weighs you down? Growing as good Christians, we not only turn away from the constant search for material wealth and things, but also from the cares and concerns that lead us to this displaced seeking. Turning away from these things frees us to turn toward God and others.



Be perfect? You've got to be kidding. I don't know anyone who comes even close, although I've known some people who think they have. PASTOR Jesus' call to a life of complete obedience and holiness drives some seekers to despair. But his

initial purpose is to bring us to our knees each day in humble repentance, confident that God's forgiveness and mercy are new and fresh for us every morning. We will never be perfect on this side of eternity. But God's Spirit moves and motivates us to be compassionate, as our heavenly Father is compassionate. Compassion is more than sympathy. Compassionate disciples walk so closely with others in their pain and struggles that they actually suffer with them, for the sake of our suffering Saviour. Jesus walked the way of sorrows to the cross, where he willingly endured the full wrath of God against sin, so that we might live as his fully forgiven children and serve as his compassionate disciples, through our earthly pilgrimage.

### Looking back over the school year








Canada Day: Canada. A federal statutory holiday, the occasion celebrates the anniversary 1. Canada Day is the national day of of July 1, 1867, the effective date of

- 2. On July 1, 1867 The British North America Act created the Canadian federal government. This act stated that Canada would become and "independent dominion" (territory) of England, which is why Canada Day was originally called Dominion Day. In 1982 Dominion Day was changed to Canada Day after a vote in Parliament.
- 3. To help them design the country's official flag. Parliament asked Canadian in 1963 to draft suggestions. Of the 3,541 patriots who responded, nearly 400 thought a beaver should be front and centre before finally deciding to use the iconic maple leaf.
- 4. Canada was derived from the Huron and Iroquois Native American language. The word "kanata" translates to village.
- 5. On the weekend of July 1, across the entire country, Canadians drink 1.2 million litres of alcohol/beer.


