Communion Reflection... We often speak of "going to Mass" as though the action is somehow separate from us-an activity, or perhaps an obligation to be fulfilled. The Eucharist is intended, rather, to be an expression of thanksgiving, which is the very meaning of the word "Eucharist." As grateful people, we gather, raise our hearts and minds to God, and join with others to ponder God's word, share in Holy Communion, and to be united with Christ and one another. The Eucharist is a great gift that is only opened through full participation. From the moment we cross the threshold of the church, we have to put our hearts into it, consciously disposing ourselves to the mystery of God's love for us in Jesus Christ through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. Perhaps, after all, we should "go to Mass," as though to run there, ready to hear, see and experience the love of God, which is given so freely. Then, when we have heard and seen and have been formed and fed, we are sent out to love and serve the Lord, glorifying God by our lives.



It can be difficult to live within our **FROM THE** families—there can be lots of PASTOR'S DESK competing interests. One

commentator said, "If you can't live within a family, you won't be able to live in society either." Is it hard to live within a family? Sure-harder still to live without them. We were made for community. Image bearers do not do well alone. We need each other. God told us it would be this way: "It is not good that a man should be alone" (Genesis 2:18). As Christians, we belong to two different families. The first is determined by our DNA, the second determined by H₂O and God's promise. Under extreme conditions, we might walk away from our blood families. Or maybe they will walk away from us. We might be tempted to walk away from our water-based family, too, but this is God's family; it can't disown us. Because, at the end of life, water is thicker than blood.
