There remains peril in proximity, but as we enter this season of repentance with a lot on our minds and in our hearts, let's mend our world together, committing to the common good, to heal body and soul. Q: Why do we get ashes on our foreheads on Ash

Wednesday? A: The ancient Jews, wearing sackcloth and covering themselves or sitting in ashes, showed repentance and humility. The early Church adopted the practice of wearing ashes at the start of Lent to show repentance too. As the priest places the ashes on our foreheads, he says, "Remember you are dust and unto dust you will return" to remind us that our time on earth will pass away, but our life in Heaven will last forever.

Fasting and Abstinence are practices of self-denial that help a person to focus on the physical, emotional and spiritual needs of others. They also clear the mind and body for deeper contemplation in praver.

Fasting requirements: One full or two light meatless meals; no eating between meals, but liquids are permitted. Age of fasting: All persons between 18 and 59. Days of abstinence:

Ash Wednesday and All Fridays during Lent

Abstinence requirements: No Meat.

Age of abstinence: All persons over the age of 14. No Catholic should fail to keep these days of required penance unless he or she has a serious reason for not observing them. The obligation on any individual day is not a question of serious sin. You may ask what penances we would suggest? The best idea during Lent is daily participation in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Try to be more patient with members of your own family and with persons working with you. Yes, abstaining from alcoholic beverages, smoking, candy, movies and TV programs gives so many opportunities for other penances. Above all, don't forget to say every morning as you open your eyes: "All for you, my Jesus, all for you!" Renew this intention often during the day. Try these few suggestions and we promise you that you will be a very different person at the end of the 40 day period which we call LENT.
